DEFENDANT'S RESPONSE TO PLAINTIFF'S MOTION TO APPEAR TELEPHONICALLY

On April 27, 2016, Plaintiff's counsel filed a Motion to Appear telephonically at the hearing on his own Motion to Withdraw as Counsel (Doc. No. 144), scheduled for April 29, 2016 at 1:30 p.m., arguing, among other things, that it would not be economically reasonable for him to attend the hearing.

However, there are a number of problems with Plaintiff's counsel's Motion which mandate his, and his co-counsel Jessica Fernandez', attendance. First, any issue related to cost or inconvenience is caused solely by Plaintiff and its current counsel, Keith Lipscomb and Jessica Fernandez. Malibu Media is a California company which has hired Florida counsel to litigate a case in Michigan. If there is any economic hardship, it is willfully caused by Plaintiff's own litigation model.

Second, in his Motion to Withdraw, Plaintiff's counsel has indicated to the Court that an *in camera* hearing may be required to determine why he should be allowed to withdraw as counsel. This simply cannot be done if Plaintiff's counsel is in Florida and other counsel on the case, and the Court, are in Grand Rapids. Defendant will be, in part, opposing Plaintiff's counsel's Motion to Withdraw (at least the extension of time requested) and will be present at the

hearing. Defendant's counsel will have to drive a minimum of three hours to attend the hearing.

Plaintiff's counsel should be expected to do the same.

Third, because he is seeking to withdraw from this case, due to "the client [failing] to

substantially fulfill an obligation to the lawyer regarding the lawyer's services," Plaintiff's

counsel is really representing his own interest, and not Malibu Media's interest. In addition, not

only has Mr. Lipscomb moved to withdraw as counsel, but so has his co-counsel from Florida,

Jessica Fernandez. (Doc. No. 143). Malibu Media has a third attorney representing it, Paul

Nicoletti, who is based in Michigan. Due to the allegations set forth in the Motions to Withdraw,

all of Malibu's attorneys should be present, particularly in light Mr. Lipscomb and Ms.

Fernandez' request for an extension of time on behalf of Malibu literally on the eve of the

hearing of Defendant's Motion for Summary Judgment and for Attorney's Fees.

Nonetheless, if the Court is inclined to allow Plaintiff to appear at the conference

telephonically, then Defendant requests the same.
